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How to maintain the safety of home environment?



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All information above has been reviewed by Hospice specialists Edited and published by the Department of Nursing, Taichung Veterans General Hospital How to provide the patient have a safety environment at home, and to avoid being hurt because of negligence. The following information could reduce the burden for your home care.

A. Factors affecting home security:

- (a)Old, frail, and visual decline that lead to poor orientation, unsteady gait or fainting.
- (b)Unconsciousness or agitation.
- (c)Environmental changes or unaccompanied.
- (d)Disease factors such as hypothyroidism, Parkinson's disease, stroke hemiplegia, diabetes, neuropathy, dementia, and degenerative arthritis.
- (e)Take diuretics and antihypertensive drugs at the same time caused postural hypotension.
- (f)Take sedative and hypnotic drugs lead to dizziness, walking instability or limb weakness, and postural hypotension.
- (g)Abnormal skin sensations (as tingling or tickling or itching or burning) usually associated with peripheral nerve damage.

B. The methods to have a safe home environment:

- (a)To keep home light adequately. You can install fluorescent lamp indoor, moreover enhance at bedside, aisle, staircase, medicine cabinet, etc.
- (b) When you use electric blanket or hot water in winter don't contact with the skin

directly to avoid being burned. If necessary, you can use electric heater or wear socks to keep warm instead.

- (c)The walkway adopts barrier-free space, and the road surface should be flat to facilitate wheelchair entry and exit.
- (d) Don't place the wires under carpet to avoid causing a fire.
- (e)Handles can be installed on the side of the toilet, sink, bath and wall. Should be installed on the health side for ease of use.
- (f)If the patient is lying in bed, the bed rails must be pulled up or a soft cushion can be placed beside the bed, In case of falling injury.
- (g)Pull up the bed bar when the patient is sober but have a risk of falling out of bed.
- (h)To avoid sliding on the slope, pay attention to the handbrake usage when using a wheelchair. When helping the patient to sit or to leave the wheelchair, put away the pedal first so as not to hurt the legs.
- (i)Use the mitts, a type of the hand restraint that helps prevent patient purposely or inadvertently pulling out nasogastric tube, catheter or trachea tube.
- (j)If the patient falls down, please feel free to contact your home care provider and call for help if necessary.

C. Conclusion

It is expected that the elderly can live in a familiar environment, and provide a

comfortable and safe space, avoid accidental injury, and delay the degradation of behavior.
